Welcome to the <u>seventh edition</u> of Newark and Sherwood District Council's Business E-Newsletter.



The first two months of 2022 have proved to be a positive start to the year, with exciting advancements in the priority projects outlined in Newark's Town Improvement Plan.

The future dreams of Newark's younger generation took another step forward as the planning application for the permanent home of the International Air and Space Training Institute (IASTI) was approved. This new state-of-the-art institute is expected to open in September 2023 and will be run in partnership with local education providers from Nottinghamshire and Lincolnshire. Once completed, it will focus on further and higher education in engineering, plus additional specialism in cyber, avionics and robotics, and communications.

Students at the temporary IASTI site are already experiencing some of the most thrilling technical training and development opportunities in the UK, including flight training in a specialised aircraft simulator, pictured above.

Meanwhile, planning permission to preserve, enhance and redevelop 32 Stodman Street, the former Marks & Spencer site, has been granted by Newark and Sherwood District Council's Planning Committee. The redevelopment will create new retail units and 29 new dwellings whilst retaining the building's art deco façade. Construction is set to begin in April 2022.

Alongside these initiatives is the announcement of a planned International Logistics Conference in March and the commencement of research to inform the district's Evening Economy Strategy. More information on these projects can be found below.

Over 50 businesses supported by the Business Resilience and **Growth Programme**

Newark and Sherwood District Council's £300,000 Business Growth and Resilience Programme has offered local businesses in four key sectors support and guidance from professional industry experts to help as the district recovers from the impact of the pandemic.

The scheme has provided participants with a 12-16 week programme of tailored workshops, 1-2-1 mentoring, business model reviews, training opportunities, and more. Businesses who complete the programme could also be eligible to apply for a discretionary grant of up to £5,000. This grant can be spent in any way they see fit to boost recovery and growth.

Advice and guidance from these specialists have helped local businesses adapt and develop plans, identify new markets, modify working methods and establish new supply chains. So far, over 50 businesses have been supported, including Newark Copper Cylinders (pictured above). Remaining spaces are quickly filling up. However, applications are still being accepted in Manufacturing & Construction, Health & Social Care and Accommodation.

In January, the Midlands Machinery Show's Apprenticeship Award saw six students accept a cheque for £250, the first in a two-year instalment totalling £500. The award recognises these young agricultural engineers for their dedication and achievements in their careers. Two of these winners are Luke and Stella, local students whose stores can be found below.

Luke, who works at Russells, Newark, said, "Growing up on a farm with my Grandad, I enjoyed helping repair machinery and driving the tractor. My proudest moment so far would be the last harvest when one of our customers snapped the front axle on his combine. It was estimated the job would take about ten days but my mentor and I ended up doing it in under half that, allowing the customer to get back to harvest without too much disruption."

Stella, who works at Farol as a John Deere apprentice, said, "During school I developed an interest in metal work and design and took a particular interest in removing and installing components." Having worked at John Deere in both Australia and the UK, Stella enjoys being given the independence to carry out jobs by herself. "I would like to inspire more women to take on this career. I would also love to own my own farm and develop a career in farming."

Evening and Night Time Economy Strategy



The NSDC Economic Growth team are now working with Night Time Economy Solutions to research and develop an Evening and Night time Economy Strategy for Newark and Sherwood. This strategy will focus on creating a more vibrant, safe and inclusive evening offer in Newark, Southwell, Edwinstowe and Ollerton.

The strategy will cater towards the specialities of each location, with examples of what the strategy will consider, including:

- Late night shopping and markets
- Promotion of heritage assets through late museum openings and night-time tours
- Early evening entertainment and cultural aspects such as the theatre, cinema and art galleries
- Cafés, pubs, restaurants and bars
- Street performances and outdoor evening events during the summer which make greater use of open spaces and longer periods of daylight
- Festive events during the winter
- Leisure activities such as sports centres, libraries, bowling alleys and activity centres
- Improving available facilities and transport

Research to inform this strategy is underway, with two more online stakeholder workshops planned for 15th March and 12th April. In addition, 1-2-1 meetings are also available. A <u>public survey</u> has also been created.

Under the scheme, eligible businesses can receive discounts of up to £5,000 off the retail price of approved Digital Accounting and CRM software. This software will help manage finances and build customer relationships, enabling more businesses to scale up.
